You can still help in other ways if not selected.

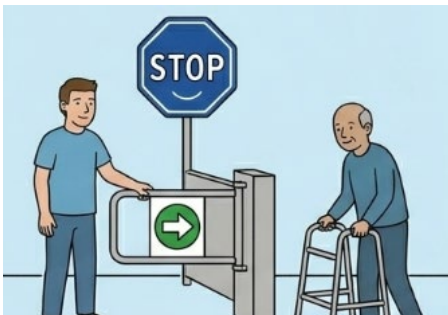
Road crossing volunteer



You help people cross the route safely.



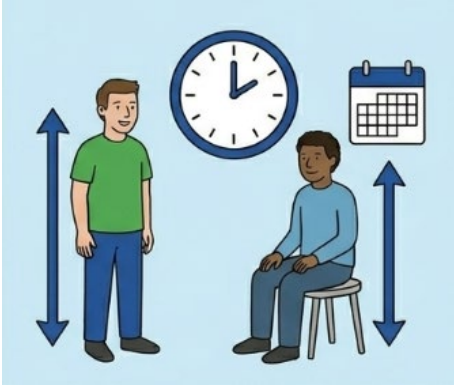
You watch for bikes and vehicles.

You must be 16 or older.

Route marshal volunteer



You stand along the route.



You help keep riders safe.



You give information to spectators.



You remind people about safety.



You may work alone but
near others.



You must be 18 or older.

Welcome and wayfinding volunteer



You welcome visitors.



You help people find the route.



You give directions and information.



You work in busy areas.

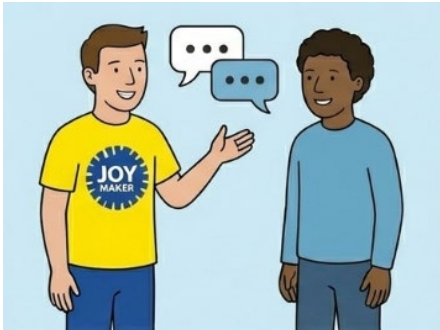


You work as part of a team.

You talk to visitors.



You help at events and fan zones.



You support activities.



You help people enjoy the day.



You work as part of a team.



You must be 16 or older.

Route volunteer team leader



You support other volunteers.



You answer questions.



You help organise shifts.



You check volunteers in and out.



You support volunteer welfare.



You must be 18 or older.

Super domestique



You help where support is needed.



You may do different roles.



You must be flexible.



You will get training on the day.



You must be 18 or older.

Yellow flag volunteer



You stand near hazards on the route.



You wave a yellow flag.



You warn riders about danger.



You may work alone.



You must be 18 or older.

Wayfinding team leader



You lead wayfinding volunteers.



You check on volunteers.



You support breaks and shifts.



You help visitors have a good experience.



You must be 18 or older.

Visitor engagement team leader



You lead visitor engagement volunteers.



You check on volunteers.



You support breaks and shifts.



You help visitors have a good experience.



You must be 18 or older.

Spectator research volunteer



You talk to people at the event.



You ask questions about their experience.



You record answers on a device.



You move around the event area.



You must be 18 or older.

Event operations volunteer



You help behind the scenes.



You support the event team.



You help the event run smoothly.



You may work before or after the event.



You must be 18 or older.
