You will get information before the event.

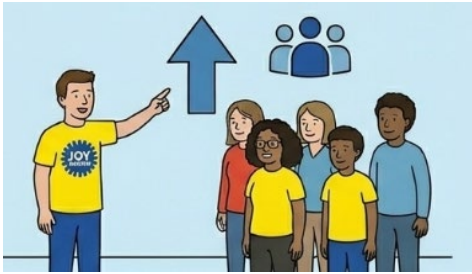


Some roles include training sessions.

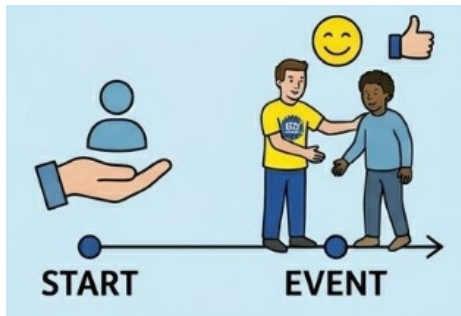


You will be told what to do on the day.

Be happy to talk to the public.

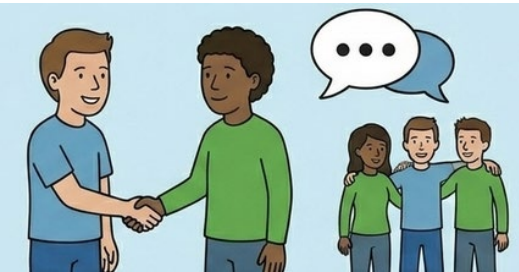
